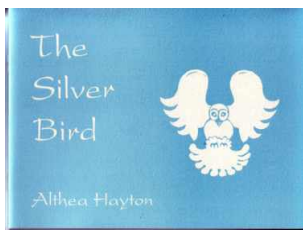
THE SILVER BIRD

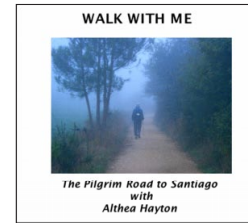
